

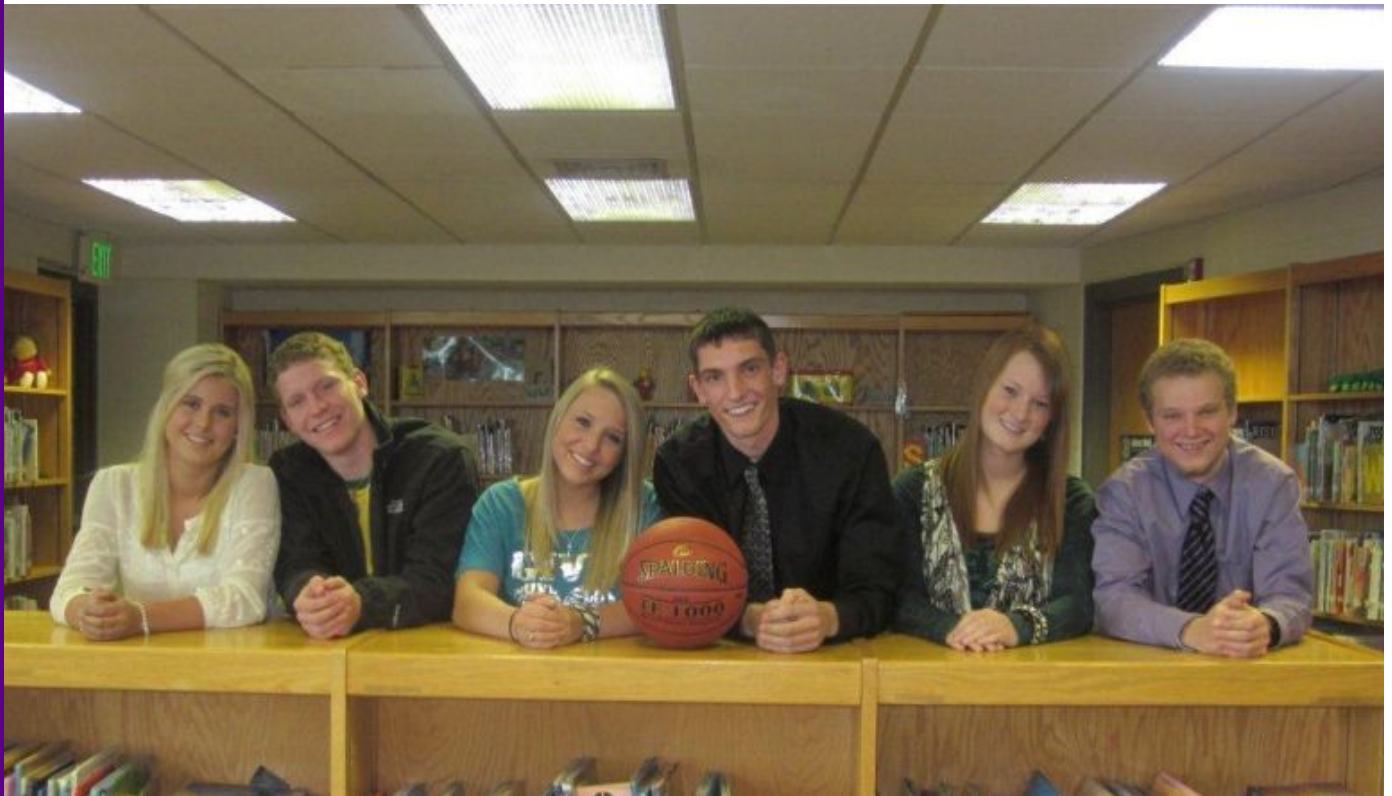

Superintendents Comments from Steve Splichal

I hope that each of you had a safe and joyous holiday. It is a great time to connect with family and friends as well as “recharge” for the new year. The hardest part of the end of a long break is getting out of bed that first morning. We often stay up a little later and sleep in a little longer and thus “reset” our internal clocks. It will take some time to return our clocks to the “school” setting.

The spring semester is a very busy time for students and staff. We are counting down to spring assessments for students in grades 3rd-8th as well as our high school students. We also have large groups of students participating in various activities ranging from basketball to scholars bowl. It can be a stressful time especially given that the weather is traditionally worse and that the cold and flu season kicks

in. I would like to encourage you to help your child develop/maintain healthy habits. It is very important for young people to get good sleep (generally 8-10 hours depending on their age) and eat right. I am sure that there were many nice electronic toys/games under Christmas trees. It is important for parents to monitor the time their child spends on games and balance that with physical activity. It would also be a great benefit to our students and staff if appointments could be scheduled outside of the school day. I know that this is not always possible given your schedule or the doctors, but any efforts to make those appointments later in the day or on days that we might be out of session would be very helpful.

I am certain that you have heard that Governor Brownback has proposed a new

school finance formula. The press releases have been distributed and individuals are now looking through the plan to determine what is in it and the impact on education. I encourage you to take a few moments to look through this proposal. As it stands now, the plan will not take affect until the 2013-14 school year. It will most certainly have an impact on how schools are able to educate students and meet the demands set forth by state and federal legislation. The McLouth School District has weathered considerable cuts (like other school districts) in recent years. It would be good to see a funding formula that consistently generates money for school districts without placing all of the responsibility on local property taxes. The investment that we make in our youth today will certainly pay dividends tomorrow.
