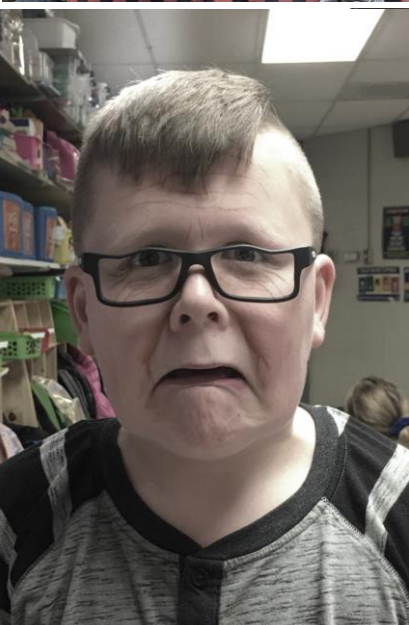
Flu, Cold, and Head Lice

Flu and Cold: Even though the number of students with flu and cold have decreased lately please keep the following in mind

- Periodically wash coats, gloves, scarves and hats
- Remind students to wash hands and to avoid touching their face
- Wipe down household surfaces while family members are ill
- Get plenty of rest and stay home when a fever is present

Head Lice: Like previous years head lice will pop up during the winter months when people are in close quarters. However unlike previous years head lice are becoming resistant to OTC (over the counter meds). Children ages 3-11 are more susceptible to head lice due to their close proximity to one another. Below are signs and steps to help mitigate a lice infestation.

- Signs include digging, itching and scratching
- Lice will most likely be found above the ears and back of neck in hair line
- If lice are indeed present the fastest route is to seek a prescription from your pediatrician especially since lice have become resistant to OTC treatments. Also wash and dry all coats, scarves, and hats.
- Home treatment will include using the prescription and checking for lice and nits each night for 10-14 days or until they are no longer present
