The **focus** for today is:

Make and Confirm Predictions

- Before you read make a guess or a prediction about what a text will be about
- As you read, stop and think about your prediction
- Was your prediction correct? Yes, you confirmed your prediction. Keep reading! No, adjust your prediction, make a new one, and keep reading!

Read the story May Day: Around the World on HMH website or p. 136-143.

Here are the questions to think about/talk about while reading: You do not need to turn any type of written or recorded response in with this. These questions are meant to guide you through the story.

- Before reading the story make a prediction about what the text will be about.
- After reading p. 139

Model for your child or say-Before reading I predicted the text would be about different May Day celebrations. I just read about how May Day is celebrated in Sweden. So I think my prediction was correct. I will keep reading to confirm that.

Why would Maria and Carlos ring the doorbell and then hide?

Answer: They want to surprise Ms. Garcia and see her reaction. This is what you do on May Day.

After reading p. 140

Why do you think people celebrate the beginning of spring?

Possible answer: In many places, it is cold during the winter. The weather gets warmer at the beginning of spring. Flowers bloom. People are happy because they can be outside.

After reading p. 141

Think back to the prediction you made before reading. Can you confirm your prediction, or do you need to adjust it? Give details from the text to explain.

What should you do next?

Answer: Keep reading
