
Rhyming Numbers

The phonological awareness tab is geared more towards the 4 year old group due to 4 year old standards. 3 year olds have not been introduced to most of these concepts yet but if you wish to try, feel free but don't work to the point of frustration.



You will need numbers 1-10, these can be written on separate sheets of paper or if you have numbers in form of magnets, puzzles, or toys that will work too!

- 1. The adult will "I am a And I rhyme with the number....." The picture shows cards but this activity will work if you simple say the sentence.
- 2. The child has to figure out which number rhymes with the word and then give you the number

- 3. The game ends when all of the numbers are gone and the rhymes are correct ©
- 4. If they struggle with hearing the word in the sentence, instead of saying the whole "I am a door, I rhyme with..." say "Door" and then they will be able to isolate the word/sound a little better without extra words to pay attention too.
