Syllable Dribble

Grab a ball the child can bounce or dribble. Have your child count out syllables in words by bouncing or dribbling a ball that many times. They can use the head shoulder knees and toes method to count out syllables before dribbling.

Snow-1 bounce/dribble

Kitten- 2 bounce/dribbles
