Graduation Requirements

- Credits
 - 1 credit = 1 full year of a class
 - Credits are issued in ½ credit at semester
- Class Standing
 - 5 credits = sophomore
 - 11 credits = junior
 - 17 credits = senior
- Credit Recovery
 - PLATO Lab
 - retakes

Graduation Requirements, continued

- 4 English/Language Arts (1 credit each year in high school)
- 3 Math (must include Algebra I and Geometry)
- 3 Science (must include Earth & Space Science and Biology)
- 3 Social Studies (must include World History, American History, and Government)
- 1 Fine Arts
- 1 Career/Tech Education (CTE or Practical Arts)
- 1 Physical Education/Health
- ½ Public Speaking and ½ Personal Finance (Sophomore Year)
- 7 Electives

24 Total Credits

Other Graduation Plans

- Board of Regents Qualified Admissions
 - Freshmen applicants, aged 21 & younger, who graduate from an accredited high school, will be guaranteed admission to six state universities by meeting the Qualified Admissions requirements designated by each university.
- Kansas Scholars Curriculum
 - Students planning on pursuing a university education directly after high school will likely be best prepared by following that prescribed course sequence. In addition, students completing the Kansas Scholars Curriculum will have one step toward eligibility for the Kansas State Scholarship.

Qualified Admissions

Emporia State University, Pittsburg State University, Fort Hays State University, & Wichita State University (Also includes Washburn—not a Regents school):

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) or Cumulative GPA 2.25+
- Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credit earned in High School

Kansas State University:

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) or GPA 3.25+
- Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credit earned in High School

University of Kansas:

- ACT 21+ (SAT 1060) and Cumulative GPA 3.25+
- <u>or</u> ACT 24+ (SAT 1160) and Cumulative GPA 3.0+
- or Cumulative GPA 3.4+
- Cumulative GPA 2.5+ for College Credit earned in High School

What is a Transcript?

- Record of your academic history
- Includes grades, GPA, test scores, and high school activities
- GPA = grade point average
 - McLouth High School uses an unweighted 4.0 scale
 - A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, F = 0
- Transcripts are used by colleges, universities, the military, and some employers

Individual Plan of Study (IPS)

- All students in McLouth High School will work with the counselor and their advisory teacher to create a plan
- Plans include:
 - Courses to be taken in high school
 - Post-secondary plans
 - Interest surveys and skills assessments
 - Xello!

What are Pathways?

- Pathways are vocational plans of study
- McLouth High School has pathways in Agriculture and Business
- Students must take at least three courses from a pathway, including an introductory, technical, and application level—and three courses must be taken in high school
- Example: Animal Science (Ag)
 - Introductory Level: Exploratory Agriculture (8th grade)
 - Technical Level: Agriscience, Animal Science
 - Application Level: Animal Health/Vet Tech

 - Business Management and Entrepreneurship
