

Learning Environments at McLouth, USD 342

There are two learning environment options through the McLouth School District:

1. On-Site/In Person
2. Remote Learning

ON-SITE LEARNING

Students will learn in the traditional setting within the building. Teachers will continue to provide instruction to students *in the classroom using a variety of resources and teaching methods. These resources may include online texts, use of Chromebooks, paper/pencil documents, etc.

**In the event of a short-term/temporary closure, students in on-site learning may shift to remote learning or a hybrid schedule as determined by health officials and district administration. Daily attendance will be required and must be documented by parents while students are at home.*

REMOTE LEARNING

Remote Learning will NOT be the same as the previous school year's conclusion. Rigor and daily/hourly attendance will be expected. Grades will be assigned and credits earned accordingly.

Remote learning will be provided through an online learning platform to ensure core instruction and electives, with academic support provided by our faculty. This platform will be monitored by our faculty and will be an extension of the school classroom/district.

If you select the remote learning option to begin the school year, your child must remain with this platform of instruction through the first semester. On-Site learning can be selected in the 2nd semester if families feel that is in the best interest of their children.

Daily attendance requirements must be met and truancy laws will be in effect when the student fails to check in daily, document attendance properly, or turn in work at the same pace and the same expectations of those attending school in the building. Parents/guardians who choose the remote learning environment will be required to document required student learning time (average of 360 minutes per day).

***For those who do not have internet access, we will work with you to ensure that learning can still be done from home.*

What's the difference between Remote Learning and Home Schooling?

If you elect to home school your student, you must register with the Kansas State Department of Education. If you choose this option for your child, an adult in the home must provide the instruction and resources necessary for the educational process and are not associated with the school district in any way.

Remote Learning allows students to enroll in our district and receive instruction and academic support from the faculty at McLouth. All learning will be assigned grades and credits will be earned through our school system.
